Clarification of News Report

The Company confirms the news article published in Business World, to wit:

"BASIC ENERGY Corp. has not given up on its service contracts to explore five areas in the Philippines for their potential capacity for geothermal energy.

'We don't have any intentions of letting go of it [geothermal service contract] because we believe that that's still the future,' Basic Energy President and Chief Executive Oscar L. de Venecia, Jr. told reporters after the company's annual stockholders meeting on Wednesday.

'We will need a lot of baseload requirements and geothermal is one of those sources for baseload. We feel that there is a lot of room for geothermal and we believe [in] the projects that we have,' he said.

Although geothermal exploration is a more expensive project than other energy resources, Mr. De Venecia said it remains viable in the long run.

The company has allocated around P60 million to P70 million as capital expenditure for its Philippine projects.

'In Mabini, we've done the first well. We're doing a confirmatory well hopefully by the end of the year if not in the first quarter of next year,' Mr. De Venecia said. 'That's the longest contract we've had. That was the first one awarded to us way back 2007.'

In confirming the above news article, please be advised that the Company continues to pursue its five (5) geothermal energy projects which were awarded by the Department of Energy in 2007 (Mabini, Batangas project) and the other four projects in 2013. These projects are in various stages of pre-development and exploration, with the Mabini, Batangas project more advanced than the rest. The first well of the Mabini, Batangas project was drilled in 2016 and completed in early 2017, while the drilling of a confirmatory well is targeted in the last quarter of this year, which may slide to the first quarter of next year, depending on DOE requirements, weather conditions, availability of the rig and other service to commence drilling.

The consortium for the project has set aside a budget of Php 50 Million for the Mabini Project for 2018 for the drilling of the confirmatory well and the testing procedures thereafter. The balance of about Php 20 Million, as mentioned in the news article, is allocated for the other geothermal energy projects of the Company.

Other Relevant Information

To date, the Company is in compliance with the reporting requirements of the Department of Energy on its geothermal energy projects, in accordance with its existing service contracts with the DOE.
